Explain why you feel this way.</p>	<p>You will attempt to sculpt a small head out of any found materials you have at home! For example tin foil, old newspaper...Then bring it in to school to show to the class and explain how you did it! If you cannot bring it in you may bring photographs instead!</p>
<p>Draw a bottle, you should include as much of the detail, reflections and shadows as you can.</p>	<p>Draw a piece of fruit or vegetable which has been cut in half. Draw the seeds and whatever else you can see inside. Use detailed line and tone.</p>	<p>Draw a bowl which contains fruit or vegetables, for example a bowl of apples.</p> <p>You can use colour if you have your own pencils or paint. If not make it a very detailed tonal drawing.</p>
